

**COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY

ORDINANCE NO. _____
AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SPEED
LIMITS ON COUNTY ROADS IN TRIMBLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY**

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has determined that it is in the best interests of the health and safety of the citizens of Trimble County to establish speed limits for county roads in Trimble County, and


WHEREAS, KRS 189.390 (5)(a) permits Fiscal Courts to enact ordinances to establish speed limits on County Roads,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TRIMBLE COUNTY FISCAL COURT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.) That the speed limit on all paved county roads in Trimble County, Kentucky shall be thirty five miles per hour (35 mph).
- 2.) That the speed limit on all non-paved county roads in Trimble County, Kentucky shall be fifteen miles per hour (15 mph).
- 3.) The Fiscal Court shall purchase speed limit signs for the termini and all intermediate crossroads of all county roads which shall be placed at all appropriate places on the county roads by the Trimble County Road Department as soon as practicable after the enactment of this ordinance.
- 4.) Nothing in this Ordinance shall prohibit the Trimble County Judge/Executive from exercising his authority pursuant to KRS 189.230 to prescribe, by notice, speed limits lower than those set out in this ordinance in the event that the County Judge/Executive in his discretion and judgment finds that any county road may, by

reason of its design, deterioration, rain, or other natural causes, would require a speed less than those set out above.

After second reading on March 24, 2003 the foregoing Ordinance was approved to be published and has been signed by the County Judge/Executive, Honorable Randy Stevens as evidence of his approval, attested under the seal of the Trimble County Fiscal Court Clerk.

ORDINANCE NO. 52005-1
AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO VICIOUS DOGS

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has recognized that there is a continuing problem in Trimble County, Kentucky with vicious dogs running loose, and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of the citizens of Trimble County that there be a consistent policy for dealing with vicious dogs running loose,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TRIMBLE COUNTY FISCAL COURT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1: Definitions:

a.) "Vicious": shall be understood to mean any dog that, while running loose, has shown a tendency to attack a human being, other dogs, livestock, poultry or other pets.


b.) "Tendency to Attack" shall be understood to mean that the dog, while running loose, has been observed by at least two independent persons to have attacked a human being, other dogs, livestock, poultry or other pets, or the same dog, while running loose, has been observed, by at least one (1) peace officer, animal control officer or such other officer as has been given authority to make such determination by the Trimble County Fiscal Court to have attacked a human being, other dogs, livestock, poultry or other pets.

c.) Within the meaning of this ordinance a dog shall not be determined to be vicious if it is confined within a kennel, fenced in yard, other fenced in area, or securely tied and attacks only within the area in which it is confined.

Section 2: Return of "vicious" dog upon first capture: If a dog found running loose is taken into custody by an enforcement officer, including a peace officer, and that dog has been determined to be "vicious" within the meaning of this ordinance, the dog shall be returned to the owner, if it is possible to determine the owner, with a written warning by the appropriate enforcement officer, that if the dog is found running loose again, the dog will not be returned.

Section 3: Dog not returned upon second capture: When a dog is taken into custody by any enforcement officer, including a peace officer, and there has been at least one (1) previous occasion that the same dog was taken into custody because it was found running loose or not confined, and was returned to the owner and, in addition, that same dog has been determined to be vicious within the meaning of this ordinance, the dog shall not be returned to the owner and the dog will be dealt with as deemed appropriate by the Kentucky Humane Society, the animal control officer employed by Trimble County, or such other officer as has been given authority to make such decisions by the Trimble County Fiscal Court.

After second reading on May 26, 2005 the foregoing Ordinance was approved to be published and on the same occasion was signed in open Court by the County Judge/Executive, Honorable Randy Stevens as evidence of his approval, attested under the seal of the Trimble County Fiscal Court Clerk.


BE IT ORDAINED by Trimble County Fiscal Court as Follows:

Section 1. Ordinance 830.8, established June 9, 1989, and any and all regulations adopted pursuant to the aforesaid ordinance shall be and are hereby REPEALED.

Section 2. Designation of the Trimble County Fiscal Court as the Governing Body responsible for the implementation of the Trimble County Area Solid Waste Management Plan.

Section 3. Removal of "109 Board" references and substituting "Trimble County Fiscal Court" or some derivation in the 2003 - 2007 Trimble County Area Solid Waste Management Plan and for each plan thereafter.

After second reading on MARCH 20, 2006 and subsequent advertisement the foregoing Ordinance was approved by the Trimble County Fiscal Court.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO:
FILING OF REAL ESTATE PLATS IN THE OFFICE
OF TRIMBLE COUNTY CLERK

WHEREAS, Trimble County has implemented subdivision regulations; and
WHEREAS, all persons intended to subdivide land in Trimble County, Kentucky
are required to comply with the county subdivision regulations; and

WHEREAS, there may be confusion with survey plats for real estate and whether
those plats must be approved for compliance with subdivision regulations

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF
TRIMBLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

"Real Estate Survey Plat" shall mean any survey of real estate submitted as
evidence of the metes and bounds description of a plot of land, whether the same is an
independent document or is submitted as a part of a deed or as an addendum to a deed.

From and after the effective date of this ordinance, all survey plats for real estate
in Trimble County, Kentucky shall be approved by the Trimble County Fiscal Court or
the office of the Trimble County Judge/Executive to determine whether said real estate
survey plat complies with the county subdivision regulations.

If the County Judge/Executive determines that the subdivision regulations do not
apply to the real estate survey plat, the County Judge/Executive shall sign off on the plat
for purposes of recording in the County Clerk's office.

If there is any question by the County Judge/Executive concerning application of
subdivision regulations to the said real estate survey plat, the same shall be submitted to
the Fiscal Court for their determination concerning application of the subdivision
regulations. If the Fiscal Court determines that the subdivision regulations do not apply,
they shall so instruct the County Judge/Executive who shall then sign off on the real
estate survey plat authorizing recording in the County Clerk's office. If the Fiscal Court
determines that the subdivision regulations do apply to the said real estate survey plat, the
party submitting the plat shall be instructed to file a subdivision application with all

supporting plats and documents to the County Judge/Executive's office for consideration by the Fiscal Court in compliance with the subdivision regulations.

After the effective date of this ordinance the Trimble County Clerk's office shall not accept any real estate survey plat for recording that has not been signed by the County Judge/Executive authorizing the same to be recorded.


After the effective date of this ordinance no person shall attempt to file a real estate survey plat with the Trimble County Clerk's office without first submitting the same for approval to the Trimble County Judge/Executive's office as set out above.

- TRIMBLE COUNTY CONTINUITY OF GOVERNMENT
ORDINANCE

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court deems it necessary to provide for the orderly succession of Office of Judge/Executive in the event of the absence or disability of the Judge/Executive as defined in KRS 67.725 when involving a national, State or local emergency; and

WHEREAS, under Kentucky Law KRS 63.190, any vacancy in the Office of the Judge/Executive is filled by the Governor. When a vacancy occurs, the County Clerk is responsible for notifying the Governor of the vacancy under KRS 63.210. A County Judge/Executive appointed in this manner serves in accordance with Section 152 of the Kentucky State Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the line of succession contained in this ORDINANCE is to insure that a County governmental official is available to serve in the absence or disability of the Judge/Executive, Deputy Judge/Executive, or any successor.

It is therefore ORDAINED that when the absence or disability of Trimble County Judge/Executive shall prevent his/her serving in the office during a national State or local emergency, the duties and responsibilities of the County Judge/Executive shall be administered temporarily by the Deputy County Judge/Executive as set forth in KRS 67.730 and 67.735.

It is also ORDAINED that if neither the County Judge/Executive nor the Deputy County Judge/Executive is able to serve in the Office of Judge/Executive by reason of absence or disability, then the duties of the Office of Judge/Executive shall be assumed temporarily by a member of the Trimble County Fiscal Court as set forth in KRS 67.740 and 67.745.
