COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY COUNTY OF TRIMBLE ORDINANCE NO. 620,/0 AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO:

REQUIREMENT OF LANDOWNERS TO OBTAIN AN ENCROACHMENT PERMIT FOR ENTRANCE FROM COUNTY ROADS

WHEREAS, entrances to private property from county roads can create a hazardous situation to the citizens of Trimble County, and

WHEREAS, the Trimble County Fiscal Court has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of Trimble County that there be regulations with regard to appropriate safe sight distances for encroachments from County Roads

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE FISCAL COURT OF TRIMBLE COUNTY, KENTUCKY AS FOLLOWS:

- 1.) No property owner shall be permitted to create an entrance to land or an encroachment upon the right of way of any county road without first having obtained a permit from the County Road Foreman.
- 2.) The County Road Foreman shall not issue an encroachment permit unless the following distance of unobstructed vision are found at the point of entrance from the county road onto the property:

Rate of Speed	Distance of Unobstructed Vision
55 mph	484 feet
50 mph	440 feet
45 mph	396 feet .
40 mph	352 feet
35 mph	308 feet
